In the northeast of North-Rhine-Westphalia where the small river Bega winds its way through the hills of Lipperland, embracing many spectacular timbered houses, lies the »Alte Hansestadt Lemgo« (old hanseatic town of Lemgo).

Lemgo was, for many years, a very important town within the trading organisation known as the »Hanse«. With approximate 43,000 citizens the university town is the third largest town in the district of Lippe. In the year of foundation for more than 800 years, important trade routes crossed here. Around the symbol of the town, the two so different spires of St. Nicolai, gather shops, cafes, and restaurants but also museums and historic buildings, all of which invite you to explore the town.

Step into the many facets of Lemgo, and discover what interests you most, in your own time. Do it on your own or together with our town guides. This brochure will give you inspiration and addresses for an enjoyable visit to Lemgo.

History meets the modern world

From the very first days, trade has always been an important part of Lemgo. Today shows Lemgo as a flourishing shopping town. More than 200 shops in the trafficfree streets invite you to "stressless" shopping.

Cast your eyes upwards: Extensively decorated imposing stone- and timbered houses from the Late-Gothic and the Renaissance periods will meet your eyes.

The main shopping street is the Mittelstrasse, which extends over a kilometre from east to west, and has, together with many side streets, a wide variety of shops. There are shops from wellknown companies as well as privately own shops.

Enjoy the atmosphere of the town market, Saturdays and Wednesdays from 7 am to 1 pm, or watch the farmers and their customers from a nearby cafe.

After your shopping tour, you may want to see more of Lemgo. With our sky-blue STADTBUS you can travel all around the town and the surrounding villages in comfort. The information as to times and destinations can be found under www. stadtbus-lemgo.de.

And the traditional »Kläschenmarket« at the beginning of December. There is something going on throughout the year.

Also in the Phoenix Contact-Arena (the home of our handball heroes) there is a lot going on. Maybe there is a home game? Or visit a performance of our theatre group »Stattgespräch« by the theatre in the railroad station.

Or if you want to do your own thing, our town guides and our night watchman are always available for a tour.





















NATURE IN THE MIDDLE OF THE TOWN

Take a deep breath

If you wish to use up some energy, then you don't have to be a professional sportsman or woman, as are the members of our handball team or our indoor cycling team.

How about taking a stroll around the town on the city wall (approx. 3 km). Even today you can see the historic town fortifications in several places. View them and reflect on the necessity of these things. The »Abteigarten« and the »Auenpark« are centrally located places to have a rest.

For a longer walk, we would recommend Lemgos town forest. Worth seeing are the »Försterteiche« (Rangers Pond) with the wildlife park. A wonderful view of the town can be enjoyed from the »Staff Landschaftspark« (a landscape park of the Staff foundation).

Total relaxation or fun with the family can be had in the Eau-Le swimming attraction or in the sauna. You can enjoy the adventure pool or the beach-sauna or a massage. It's all available.





LEMGOS GREEN SURROUNDINGS

Nature in front of the door

Nothing compares with nature when it comes to relaxing. In Lemgo, nature comes directly up to the door. If you have had a walk along the city wall and are looking for something new: After a few minutes' drive you are in the town forest with the »Försterteiche« or the »Staff Landschaftspark«.

Enjoy the peace at the »Försterteiche«. The wildlife park offers Children something different. Follow the signs to the »Windelstein« and you have reached the highest point (347 m) of the town.

Scan the QR-Code and enjoy a virtual walk from the »Försterteiche« to the »Staff Landschaftspark«. There is also a route plan to the area:













THE »JUNKERHAUS«

The »Junkerhaus« is a creation of the artist Karl Junker (1850–1912). After his apprenticeship as a carpenter and several jobs in Hamburg and Munich, he returned to Lemgo and in 1889 he built the two-story house. He worked for more than 20 years carving and painting, fitted it with furniture that he had designed and built, and decorating until he died of Pneumonia in 1912.

THE »FRENKEL-HAUS«

The memorial »Frenkel-Haus« is an institution of the town of Lemgo. There is a permanent-exhibition about the Jewish family Frenkel in their original

house. The family lived and worked here in the middle of the town until their deportation on the 28th of July 1942.

THE »HEXENBÜRGER-MEISTERHAUS«

The name of the in 1568–1571 built house reminds us of the town mayor Hermann Cothmann (1629–1683).

The last wave of witch-hunting in Lemgo took place during his term-of-office. He in person was an eager witch hunter. Today's museum, in an important building in the style of the Weser-Renaissance, takes visitors on a journey through the history of Lemgo and the witch hunting.

THE »WESER-RENAISSANCE MUSEUM« IN »SCHLOSS BRAKE«

The castle »Schloss Brake« was built in 1584 as a residence for the counts of Lippe in the style of the renaissance. It is surrounded by a moat and was built on the foundations of one of the largest middle-aged castles in northern Germany. The striking tower makes it to a landmark of the town of Lemgo which can be seen from a considerable distance. The »Weser-Renaissance Museum« gives you an overall Insight in the cultural history of the 16th and 17th century. Selected objects regarding architecture, painting, graphics, furniture, festivals, table decorations, cooking, religion, science, and trade are complimented through productions from the early days of science like an alchemy laboratory or an art room and a chamber of curiosities.

TOWN GALLERY »EICHENMÜLLERHAUS«

A house – it could have been built to accommodate art. The town gallery was opened in 1989. The House was built in the second half of the 18th century and was presented to the town of Lemgo by the owner family Gertrud Eichenmüller-Sonntag and Ludwig Eichenmüller. Year by year there are eight or nine exhibitions in the genre painting, graphic, sculpture, installation, photography, video and performance.






»STAFF LANDSCHAFTSPARK«




